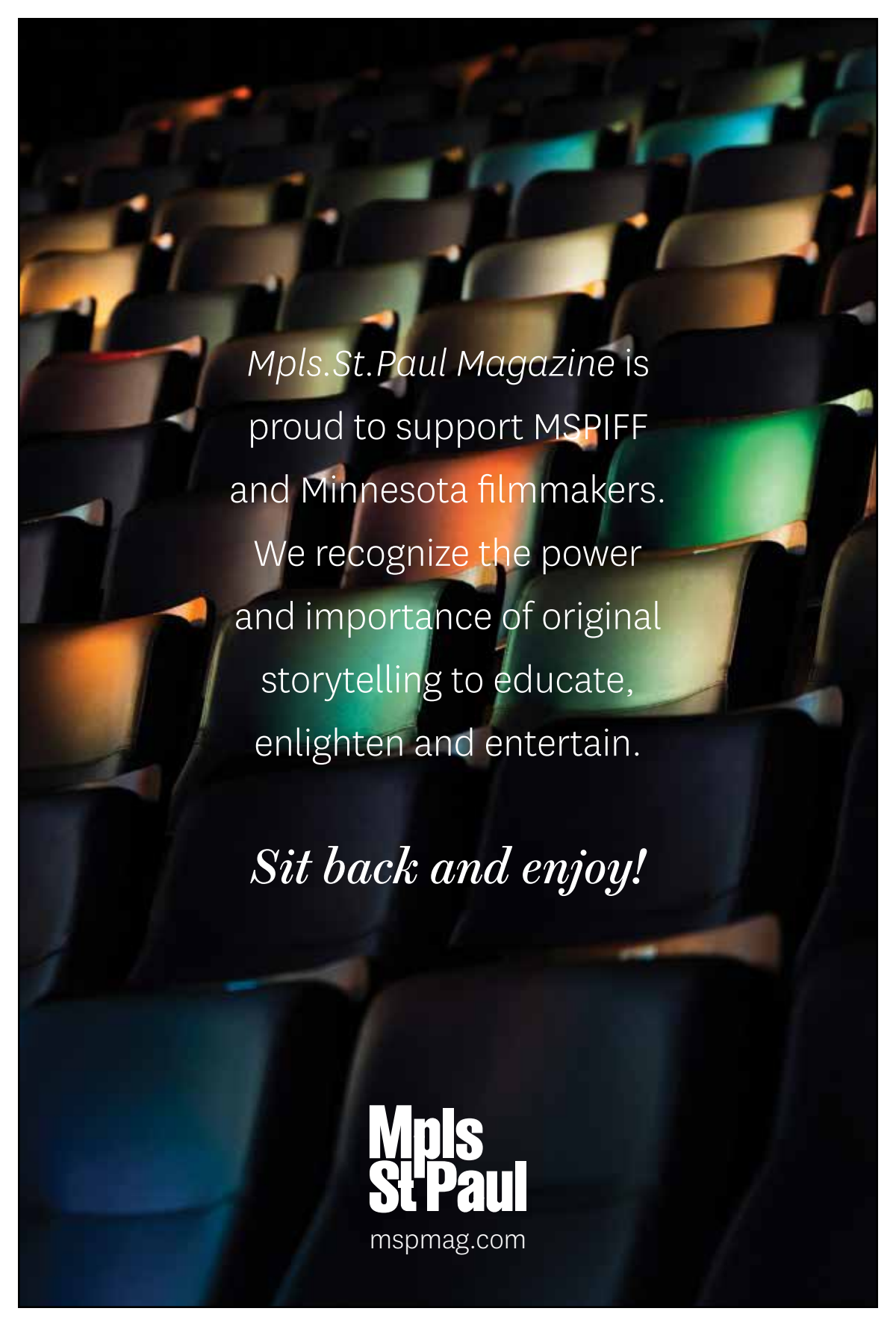

MSP Film is a member-driven, community-centered, 501(c)(3) non-profit organization. Our mission is to unite, inform and transform individuals and communities through the power and art of great cinema. Our vision is to offer the best of international and independent cinema to audiences and to support the artists who tell these powerful stories.

MSP Film (aka The Film Society of Minneapolis St. Paul). Founded in 1962 as a ground-breaking film exhibitor offering a unique blend of cutting-edge foreign cinema to local audiences, MSP Film has, over the years, become the region's unrivaled leader in curating and showcasing international and independent cinema. Every year, we offer our audiences the opportunity to experience more than 600 award-winning, critically-acclaimed documentary and dramatic films, many of which are simply not otherwise available on the big (or small) screen in our region, all of which represent the best in cinematic story-telling - with screenings often enriched by conversations with filmmakers - from every corner of the globe.

MSP Film Events/Series/Festivals. We offer films through our daily theatrical screenings at The Main Cinema and through numerous ongoing curated film events, series and festivals including our annual centerpiece, the **Minneapolis St. Paul International Film Festival** (est. 1981), **Cine Latino** (est. 2012), **Lumières Françaises** (est. 2015), **Images of Africa** (est. 2024), or **National Theatre Live, Cinema Club** and **Midnight Mayhem** to name just a few, and partner events from the Arab Film Fest to the Italian Film Fest. Our programs have a distinct focus on international cinema and, increasingly, reflect the experiences of and engage audiences that represent the vibrant, ever-evolving cultural landscape of our state.

MSP Film's The Main Cinema. In 2022, MSP Film took a leap, assuming all operations and programming at our longtime hub in Minneapolis' Historic St. Anthony Main Mississippi riverfront neighborhood. We refurbished and renamed our venue The Main Cinema or The Main. Today, thanks to you - our many longtime and new friends and patrons - The Main is a bustling 5-screen destination for cinephiles and movie buffs from far and wide and a point of pride for the neighborhood and city. In 2025, we filled 165,000 seats at **The Main**. In the words of one member: *With its signature international film fare curated by MSP Film, The Main has become a cultural magnet, not only 'at the heart of' but 'the heart of' our historic neighborhood.*

With your ongoing support, we will continue to bring the enlightening and enchanting world of cinema to our community.
